March 8, 2016 Meeting Barnstable Intermediate School

Attendance Head Count: 46 including officers, parents, and district personnel; 7 children in Child Care.

SEPAC Business Meeting

President Jeannie Randall called the meeting to order at 5:45 p.m., welcomed everyone, and expressed appreciation to Principal Jim Anderson for hosting the meeting. Jeannie noted the purpose of the meeting is to gather input for improving special education to submit to the district administration.

Suggestions have been provided for next year's SEPAC presentations—Executive Function Disorder and Bullying. Parents are encouraged to suggest presentations they feel would be helpful.

The minutes of the February meeting were forwarded to Dr. Jezard, School Committee Chair Weber, and Interim Superintendent Butler. SEPAC will continue to keep track of various concerns to see whether or not it appears to be an isolated situation or if it is presenting as a concern for more than one parent/guardian.

Comments/Suggestions from Parents Included:

- A parent expressed concern that her child has been diagnosed with dyscalculia and there are no math specialists in the District. There is not a lot of help for students who are struggling with math. This is a huge concern, especially with her child coming into BIS next year. Barnstable needs to get a math specialist(s) into the schools.
- A parent, who is new to the District, asked how information about SEPAC and other resources is communicated to families. Kathy Bent mentioned that she would get some information about SEPAC together for the schools to have on hand for when families arrive mid-year. She reminded parents that the best way to stay up-to-date is to check the website regularly.
- A parent was concerned that accommodations needed for a specific medical condition a were not provided. A short discussion recommending that if a problem cannot be resolved at the Team-level, contacting Dr. Jezard would be the next step.

Strategies for communicating effectively, developing self-awareness and building self-esteem were also included.
